Exhibits in this section MUST be on the ground not later than 8am Friday, 3rd September 2010. A Steward will be in attendance at the Pavilion on the preceding Thursday afternoon and night: 5 pm to 8.30 pm. Exhibitors are requested to bring in as many exhibits as possible on Thursday evening, buckets will be provided for entries of Greenstuffs. Exhibits are to be on show until the Pavilion closes at 8.30pm on Saturday.

Collection of Exhibits will take place on Sunday Morning, between 830am and 1 0.30am. Exhibits not collected by 10.30am on Sunday will be disposed of unless other arrangements have been made.
