SPECIAL REGULATIONS

1 NO DAIRY CATTLE will be admitted to the grounds
unless thoroughly tractable.

2 All cattle must be (a) Free of Ticks and (b) from an
E.B.L. Accredited or certified free farm or have a
clear E.B.L AGID test within 6 months of the Show.

3 Stock not accompanied by a fully completed waybill
will be refused entry to the Grounds.

4 Sawdust/shavings bedding will be supplied at cost;
however if exhibitors wish to supplement that
supplied, there are no special regulations governing
its entry to the Showgrounds.

EXHIBITORS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR
STACKING SOILED BEDDING AND MANURE IN
NEAT HEAPS IN LANEWAYS.

5 Veterinary Services: Contact Phone Numbers are
available at the Secretary's Office for Veterinary
Services.

6 Disposal of Milk: Exhibitors are to make their own
arrangements regarding milk produced on the
ground. However, it must not be stored on the
Grounds. Milk cannot be disposed of on the
Showground.

7 All cattle entered must be registered in the name of
the exhibitor as owner, in a Herd Book of the
respective Breed and recognised by the Society for
that breed in accordance with the rules of the Herd
Book Society. Any animal owned by a partnership, or
group of persons, may be entered in the name of the
joint owners or, with the written consent of the others,
in the name of any one or in joint names of two or
more of the co-owners. All animals are entered in
accord with Breed Society regulations. The only
Holsteins eligible to be shown in appendix system
are appendix 1, 2, 3 & 4.

8 Each exhibitor must state on his entry form the
number of classes in which he intends to compete,
and full particulars of each animal entered, viz.:
Name in full, date of birth, tattoo number and or herd
book number. The responsibility for the accuracy of

the description and pedigree, and for the eligibility of
each animal entered, rests solely with the exhibitor.
ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNLESS THE
ANIMALS IN THE CLASSES, WHERE REQUIRED,
ARE NAMED ON THE ENTRY FORM.

All cattle entered for competition must conform to the
Rules and Regulations of the respective Breed
Society. REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE MUST BE
AVAILABLE ON DAY OF SHOW.

9 The entry of any female entered as dry shall be
transferred to the correct "in milk" class and vice
versa. The Stewards must be notified as early as
possible to enable them to have the transfer effected.

10 Under special circumstances cattle entered in
general classes can be entered into extra classes on
judging day at double entry fee.

11 In all Dairy Classes in which age is a condition of
the competition, the entry form shall state the
competition, and the actual date of birth (Day, Month
and Year). Age for classification will be that of the
animal on June 1st in the year of the Show.

12 Any animal which in the opinion of the Stewards is
not in a fit state or in any way not eligible to be
exhibited, may be rejected by them and debarred
from competing in the class or classes
for which it is entered. Any animal rejected must be
removed from the Showgrounds as soon as the
exhibitor is notified.

13 For dry cow classes, cows may be shown dry, or if
lactating be milked out by 8.30am judging morning.

14 In any class in which production records are
required, the F.O.S. Scheme (Farmer's Own Sample)
is an approved herd recording scheme.

15 In a special or group class, no animal can
compete unless it is entered and shown in one of the
general classes. Provided that the Stewards may in
special circumstances related to the time of a cow
calving on the grounds, permit her to be shown in a
special or group class although she has not been
shown in one of the general classes.

16 The same animal cannot be exhibited in more
than one group in any group class.

17 All cattle must be in their stalls on the grounds not
later than 8 a.m. on the Friday of the Show. All Broad
Ribbon Winners must remain on the Showgrounds
until after the Grand Parade on the Saturday of the
Show.

18 If in the opinion of a Steward of a Section, an
exhibit in such section requires veterinary treatment,
and then if the exhibitor cannot be contacted
immediately, the Steward may instruct a Veterinary
Surgeon to treat such exhibit, and the costs of such
Veterinary Surgeon shall be paid by the exhibitor to
the Show Society. The Show Society shall not be in
any way liable to an exhibitor for any damage to or
injury to such exhibit.

19 No Drug, Hormone or Tranquillizer shall be
administered to any animal exhibit, except by
permission of the Steward or under the direction of
the Veterinary Surgeon, who shall advise the
Steward, if in his opinion such drug, hormone or
tranquillizer is likely to have any effect upon the

animal which would be material to its chance of being awarded a prize, and in such case the Stewards may debar the animal from competing. The Steward may at any time, direct the Veterinary Surgeons to take a sample or skin scraping of blood, saliva, urine, discharge, exudation or any other sample from an exhibit for testing.

20 Prize Money will be as follows, unless specifically mentioned in the schedule of classes. In Milk including Best Udder Classes:-

First Prize \$11, Second \$8 and Third \$5. All other classes: - First Prize \$6, Second \$4 and Third \$3.

21 Entry fee for all classes: - \$2.20 per entry

22 Should any competitor, spectator, exhibitor or employee of such, disobey, obstruct or abuse a Steward in the execution of his duties, he shall be liable to forfeiture of his prize money, and shall be EXCLUDED from further competing at the Show.

23 A "junior" is defined as an animal under 3 years of age on June 1st, of the year in which the Show is held. The ageing applies to both Society and Special Classes.

24 FOR CHAMPION PRIZES - all first prize winners 3 years and over to compete. JUNIOR CHAMPION PRIZE - All first prize winners under 3 years to compete (with the exception of those eligible for Juvenile classes). For JUVENILE CHAMPION those under 2 years old dry shall compete. After selecting the Champion, the Judge will be required to select an animal for "Reserve" which will take the place of the Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause. Reserve shall be selected from the remaining first prize animals, together with the second prize of the class which furnished the Champion, which must be paraded prior to judging of the Reserve Champion.

25 Champion and Reserve animals from their respective breed the previous day will be paraded for Supreme honours. Also first and second place winners for best udder classes. They will be paraded in order of their placing on Friday. Only first placing for Supreme pens of three and Type and Production are required.

26 The exhibitor of every animal to which a prize has been awarded shall parade such animal in the Grand Parade conducted by the Show Society on the Saturday of the Show, unless the exhibitor produces to the Stewards a veterinary certificate that the animal is not fit to be paraded, or unless the Stewards decide that other good and sufficient reason exists to excuse any animal from parading.

27 FOR TYPE AND PRODUCTION CLASSES:- The following 305 day butterfat and Protein standards apply:

Butterfat Protein

Junior 2 years old (under 2.5 at calving) 120 kg. 100 kg.

Senior 2 years old (2.5 and under 3 at calving) 130 kg. 110 kg.

Junior 3 years old (3 and under 3.5 at calving) 140 kg. 120 kg.

Senior 3 years old (3.5 and under 4 at calving) 145 kg. 125 kg.

Junior 4 years old (4 and under 4.5 at calving) 150 kg. 130 kg.

Senior 4 years old (4.5 and under 5 at calving) 155 kg. 135 kg.

Mature (5 and over at calving) 160 kg. 140kg.

Open to all cows and heifers exhibited in individual breed classes.

Production will be judged on the amount of butter- fat plus protein produced in the first 305 days from calving (or upon ceasing to lactate if less than 305 days from calving) provided that the lactation period is completed between 1st July 2009 and 30th June 2010.

Production points will be a maximum of 50 for butterfat and a maximum of 50 for protein and will be allotted as follows:- One point for every 4 kg. of butterfat a cow has to her credit over the Standard of Age, and 1 point for every 3 kg. of protein a cow has to her credit over the Standard of Age. Production records must result from recording of cows in an approved herd recording scheme. Proof of the production figures must be lodged with entry form.

100 Points will be allowed for type. The exhibit obtaining the greatest aggregate will be awarded the prize. The Name of the Exhibit is to be stated on the Entry Form.

28 In type & production class in which production is taken into account, cows will not be eligible for a prize if the butterfat content of the lactation as assessed by the recording body, averages less than 3.3% or if protein averages less than 3% true protein mass/volume.

29 Dairy Cattle Exhibitors (excluding BSS members) are required to purchase a Show Attendant's Pass which is \$12 at present, covering 1 to 6 head of cattle exhibited. Thereafter a Free Attendant's Pass will be issued for every additional 6 head or part thereof, to a maximum of 3 Free Attendant's Passes per Exhibitor.

30 ORDER OF PARADE - Supreme Dairy Cow, Champion Butterfat Cow, Reserve Butterfat Cow. Followed by the other Breeds in order of greatest to least number exhibits.

31 THE FOLLOWING PRACTICES OR PROCEDURES ARE CONSIDERED UNACCEPTABLE AND ARE DEFINED AS BEING FRAUDULENT AND/OR UNETHICAL IN THE SHOWING OF DAIRY CATTLE.

(a) Any animal found to have had the udder or teat placement tampered with, will disqualify the whole team of which she is a representative.

(b) While teat sealing is not encouraged, it will not be considered udder tampering.

(c) Setting the teats or manipulating a teat to alter its normal position such as to unnaturally hold it plumb or to alter its length.

(d) Surgery or insertion of foreign matter under the skin, performed to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, though not to

preclude practices required or involved in normal management.

(e) Her exhibitor will be disqualified from participating further in the competition and will surrender any prize ribbons and prize money awarded prior to the disqualification.

32 CATTLE TICK TREATMENTS (for stock returning to Tick Free areas) Beaudesert Showgrounds does not have an approved livestock spraying facility. Livestock exhibitors wishing to return to the Cattle Tick Protected and Free Areas should contact the Department of Primary Industries to arrange for return treatments at one of the Line Clearance Facilities.

33 All dairy cattle entering showgrounds must be fitted with a NLIS ear tag. NLIS readings will commence at 7.00am before Judging on Friday. This cost will not be covered by the Beaudesert Show Society. Readings will be organised by the Local Breed Societies. Enquiries to Laurie Dunne Ph 5544 2193

MILKING COMPETITIONS

In addition to the General Regulations pertaining to Dairy Cattle, the following Special Regulations will apply:-

1 All competing animals must have calved seven clear days prior to the commencement of the Competition.

2 Only animals entered in General Classes are eligible for milking competition, although entry numbers only need be submitted by the closing date. Full name and particulars of competing animals must be handed to the Chief Steward of milking competition by 4pm on the Wednesday preceding strip-out.

3 All cows competing in the milking competition must be stripped out at the Showgrounds in the presence of Stewards at 6 p.m. on Wednesday 1st September 2010. The cow is checked by Stewards. COWS MUST BE IN THEIR STALL TWO HOURS PRIOR TO STRIP-OUT: THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO. Milking times for testing purposes: 6am to 7.30 am and 6pm to 7.30pm on the following day. All cows to be given 24 hours clear from the commencement of the strip-out milking to the conclusion of the competition. Times to be identical in any competition, machine or hand milking optional. All animals will be allotted stalls prior to the first strip-out. A Steward must be present.

4 Each division of a Milking Competition shall be of 20 minutes duration, with a five minute break for returning cows to their respective stalls.

5 If at any time during the competition, it becomes obvious to the Stewards that any one cow has withheld her milk at the strip-out; such cow will be disqualified by the Chief Steward.

6 Butterfat and Protein will be calculated by means of the current Testing Facilities open to Stewards.

7 All milking competitions will be supervised by the Stewards, who will see that all conditions as laid down are adhered to, and should any competitor,

exhibitor or employee of such disobey, obstruct or abuse an Honorary Steward in the execution of his duties, he will be liable to forfeiture of his prize money, and may be excluded from further competition at the Show.

8 Attendants and Officials only will be permitted in and around the milking stalls during the competition and Stewards have the authority to order away any other persons disturbing the cows.

9 Cows will not be eligible for a prize if the butterfat content of milk averages less than 3.3%.
