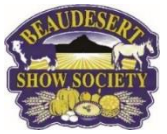




# BEAUDESERT SHOW

#### Conditions of Entry:

- All exhibits to be on the benches by 8.00am Friday.
- Exhibitors will provide their own vases etc. for exhibits.
- When necessary exhibits will be watered by Stewards after judging.
- Vases or other containers used by exhibitor will not be taken into consideration when judging the exhibits unless specified.
- Where "Distinct" appears in the schedule, it will be taken to mean Distinct Colours or Distinct Varieties.
- No Championship or Prize will be awarded unless in the opinion of the Judge, the exhibit is worthy of the award.
- All Exhibits, except Floral Work, must be grown by exhibitors.
- A vase is taller than it is wide.
- A bowl is broader than it is tall and must be round.

- Where two exhibitors tie for First Place - no Second Prize is awarded.
- Exhibitors tying for First, share First and Second Prize Money.
- For allotting points for Trophies when two exhibitors tie for First Place, points for the First and Second are divided.
- In the event of an overall tie, a count back of placings will be carried out at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- Stewards will be in attendance on Thursday from 2.30pm to 7:30pm and Friday from 7.30am to 8.00am to receive exhibits. Exhibits are to be on show until the Pavilion closes at 8.30pm on Saturday.
- Collection of Exhibits will take place on Sunday morning 8th September, between 8.30am and 10.30am.
- Points to be allocated as follows: Champion 5, First 3, Second 2.

**Exhibits not collected by 10.30am on Sunday will be disposed of unless other arrangements have been made.**
