Entry to the Beaudesert Show Grounds is via Jane Street (gate#6) and Tina Street (gate #5) - which will be open 3.00pm Thursday 4th April.

Entry onto the grounds is strictly prohibited before this time.

- No telephone nominations or late nominations accepted. The 1. draw will be available on the Show's website & ACA website.
- All nominations must be via Campdraft One. 2. www.campdraft.com.au
- 3. Limited to 8 first round runs excluding the restricted and futurity drafts.
- 4. Cattle levy kept of \$30.00 per scratching per run scratched.
- 5. SCRATCHINGS: if a competitor scratches from this weekend's draft program then ACA D.4 and D.5 rules apply.
- 6. All scratching's and/or changes to horse rider combinations must be made 20 minutes before the nominated draft begins.
- NO CHANGES to DRAW will be accepted after 7. commencement of program. Changes to horse/rider combinations to be made prior to 60 minutes before the draft starts. Maximum of 2 changes only per competitor for the whole weekend.
- Entry money to be receipted before nominations are allocated 8. and prize money and /or refunds will be bank transferred after the draft.
- 9 Dress: Campdraft competitors must wear a hat (not a cap) or safety helmet, boots and collared, full buttoned long sleeve shirt and long trousers in competition. Competitors must be neat and presentable.
- Competitors must be suitably attired and mounted for 10. presentations.
- Every horse to be named. All horses to be run in order of draw. 11.
- All competitors in all events compete at their own risk. 12.
- 13. The decision of the Campdraft Committee on all matters will be final.
- In the event of a tie for first place, competitors concerned will 14. compete in a further round to decide the winner.
- All conditions to apply at time of draft and nominations in any 15. event will be taken as acceptance of the above conditions.
- HORSE'S STATUS: The status of a horse winning a 16. campdraft will be determined by the highest class of horse that competes with the exception of Mini, Juniors, Juveniles, Ladies, Mens, Old Buffers, Associates and Encouragement campdrafts. The winner attains the status of the highest class of horse participating (e.g. if one Open horse competes then it is classed as an Open draft).
- Only committee members and stewards are allowed to 17. work in the ring.

- 23. Minimum Stallion Containment Requirements - ACA Rule 11.12

In daylight hours you may either: A: Stallions to be double tied. Stallions to have an exclusion perimeter erected around the horse and area they are tied to be excluded from any possible interaction between the stallion and another horse or human. OR

B: Stallions to be enclosed by panels. Stallions can be free to roam inside the panel area when an exclusion perimeter is erected around the panelled area to exclude any possible interactions between the stallion and another horse or human. Only 1 horse allowed per enclosure. Panels must be a minimum of 1500mm in height. Panels must be constructed using an equivalent of 4 solid object i.e. truck, post or tree. The same rules apply to daylight hours with the addition for a stallion that is in panels must have at least one additional form of restrain e.g. tied up, hobbles, sideline.

- Refunds applicable to Scratching's ACA Rule D.5 24. A 100% refund of the nomination fee will be given if the competitor withdraws more than 168 hours (7days) prior to 8:00am on the first morning of the program. If a competitor withdraws less than 168 (7 days) prior to 8:00am on the first morning of the program, then the entire nomination fee may be retained by the committee.
